

1989 Lady Pioneer Softball Outlook

First-year head coach Elizabeth "Bippy" Luckie enters her first season at the helm of the 1989 Sacred Heart University softball team with a solid group of veterans returning from last year's 41-10 combine which captured the New England Collegiate Conference championship and finished second in the NCAA Northeast Regional.

The Lady Pioneers return nine lettermen, including seven starters from that team but are not very deep with only 12 players listed on the roster. "One of the keys is that we will just have to be relatively injury free in order to have a successful season," said Luckie.

Key performers that will have to be replaced are second team All-American Maryanne Piorek (.257), leading hitter Stacey Squires (.347) at second and outfielder Kim DeCarlo (.302).

Heading the list of returnees is second team All-America pitcher Pauline Madrid, first baseman Pam Wallace (.333), junior shortstop Alecia Stephenson (.315), senior second baseman Trish Tracey (.298), outfielder/pitcher Vicki Kennedy (.290), third baseman Diane Nicholls (.250), sophomore outfielder April King (.263), sophomore catcher Donna Charchenko (.173) and senior outfielder Stephanie Manning (.202). Tracey and Manning, the lone two seniors, will serve as co-captains.

Sophomore Lisa Savoid, the starting point guard on the basketball team, is out for the team for the first time and could turn into a pleasant surprise for Luckie. Savoid possesses great speed, makes things happen on the bases and could see action from the start as the designated hitter.

Other newcomers are freshmen infielders Kim Quensinberry (Milford) and Tracy Augustine (Stratford), who are both expected to see action in utility roles.

Madrid (28-4, 0.58 ERA) and Kennedy (13-4, 0.71) were an efficient one-two combination on the mound last year as the pair combined to lead the nation in team ERA. Madrid and Kennedy will have to duplicate or better those numbers if the Pioneers want to make their seventh NCAA post-season tourney appearance in the last eight seasons.

Luckie to Guide Lady Pioneers

Elizabeth "Bippy" Luckie, a two-time All-America softball player at Sacred Heart University, will be serving her first season as Assistant Athletic Director and Head Softball Coach at Sacred Heart University.

Luckie assumes the duties after the untimely passing of Allyson Rioux of a brain tumor at her home in Stamford on Feb. 9.

Luckie was a softball and basketball standout at SHU for three years, after transferring from Jefferson CC (Watertown, NY) where she gained All-America honors in softball and basketball. She holds 15 offen-



sive records in softball with a .370 career batting average and is considered to be one of the best female athletes to ever have performed for the Pioneers.

The native of Ogdensburg, N.Y., was a First Team Converse NCAA Division II All-American shortstop in 1985 and a second-team selection her junior season in 1985. Luckie was an outstanding talent on the hardcourt as well. She holds four individual scoring records, including the single game mark of 42 points vs. Rhode Island College her junior season. She also led the New England Collegiate Conference in scoring her sophomore season with a 19.0 norm.

A Dean's List student who majored in Criminal Justice at Sacred Heart, Luckie served as Head Volleyball Coach in 1985 and Assistant Softball Coach in 1986.

Ed Macciocca

Assistant Coach

Very few people have contributed as much to the game of softball as veteran sports enthusiast Ed Macciocca, who has served as an assistant coach on the Sacred Heart staff since the program's inception 10 years ago. The popular and amiable mentor was inducted into the Connecticut Amateur Softball Hall of Fame in 1985 and received the Sacred Heart Outstanding Service Award in 1983 for his many unselfish contributions to the Sacred Heart community. Macciocca has toiled on the sidelines for 40 years as the manager-sponsor of top-notch amateur combines




from 1950-1986, compiling an overall record of 720-467 (that's 1,187 games) during his career. He became well-known as the manager-sponsor of the Bridgeport Coeds, which Ed started back in 1962. The Bridgeport native posted a 591-402 record with the Coeds, seven of those wins came against the Raybestos Brakettes, while playing in 19 state, 12 regional and seven national ASA tournaments. The Aetna Life Insurance Company picked up the Coeds sponsorship in 1984 and they finished 12th in the national ASA event in Tonowanda, N.Y. and split four games in the 1985 event in Lansing, Michigan to place 13th. His best finish was sixth in the 1977 national tourney. The Coeds captured 12 Conn. ASA titles and four New England regional crowns. He is the person mainly responsible for keeping Pioneer Park in such outstanding condition during the season.







Power-pitcher Pauline Madrid came to Sacred Heart last year from Pierce Junior College (Los Angeles) with some impressive credentials and the hard-throwing righty lived up to those expectations...Was asked to follow in the footsteps of four-time All-America pitcher Debbie Tidy and Madrid answered the call with a sparkling 28-4 record and a 0.58 ERA in 293.6 innings of work. Madrid appeared in 36 of the Pioneers 51 games with 34 complete games and 13 shutouts to her credit as she was selected to the Division II All-American second team and was the MVP in the NECC...She struck out 127 and walked only 33 while allowing only 23 earned runs...Established herself as one of the best hurlers in the nation with an excellent rise along with a drop and changeup to keep the opponents offstride...Earned MVP, All-League and All City honors four straight years at Kennedy H.S. in Grenada Hills, Calif., with a sparkling 61-12 scholastic ledger with 10 no-hitters and 23 shutouts...Was 26-3 at Pierce and has played with the Southern California Flames and the Goleta Waves during past summers...Pitched in 16 of the last 18 games, winning 14 of them.



Post 2-1 and capped a week in which she had four homers while she tripled and scored the only run in a 1-0 win over Franklin Pierce which was Sacred Heart's 300th softball victory...Was a key performer for the basketball team as she started all 24 games while averaging four points a contest...Has established herself as a solid all-around player who will again be an effective leadoff hitter with a good eye who can hit for power and for average...Made a memorable debut her freshman year with a home run in her first at-bat in a 2-0 win over SE Missouri.


