1993 EAST REGIONAL HOST INSTITUTION

Bloomsburg University is a multi-purpose institution of higher education serving the citizens of Pennsylvania as one of the 14 Commonwealth-owned universities in the Pennsylvania State System of Higher Education. With a commitment to provide a quality, affordable education for all qualified students, Bloomsburg combines the tradition of an institution founded in 1839 with modern learning, living, and recreational programs and facilities. Commonwealth funding provides 55 percent of Bloomsburg's annual operating budget.

Enrollment for the 1992-93 academic year totalled 7,551 students. There were 5,994 full-time and 1,034 part-time undergraduates and 173 full-time and 400 part-time graduate students. Instruction is provided by a 369-member faculty.

The university's 173-acre campus overlooks the Town of Bloomsburg and the scenic Susquehanna Valley. Carver Hall, built in 1867, provides a contrast with the modern facilities that include seven residence halls, a library, a 2,000-seat auditorium, student union, dining hall, gymnasium, administration building, six classroom buildings, and athletic and recreational areas on the lower campus.

An athletic and recreational complex occupy the school's 100-acre upper campus. In addition, a residence complex which provides housing for 384 junior and senior students is situated on the upper campus.

Located 80 miles northeast of the state capital of Harrisburg, Bloomsburg is within two miles of two interchanges of Interstate 80. A pair of interstate bus lines serve the community, and commercial airports at Wilkes-Barre/Scranton and Williamsport are approximately an hour's drive from Bloomsburg.

1993 EAST REGIONAL PREVIEW

The second-ranked Bloomsburg University softball team will make its 11th-straight appearance in the NCAA Division II national tournament and is the host of one of four regionals for the fifth time in the last seven years. This season's East Regional features the host Huskies, who will be attempting to advance to the championship rounds of the event for the fourth-consecutive season, and three other talented squads. The regional champion will earn the right to play in the NCAA Division II "final four" in Shawnee, Kan., May 21-23.

In a game featuring the two teams that have made the most NCAA tournament appearances, Bloomsburg meets Sacred Heart (Conn.), which is in its 10th NCAA event, in the tourney's opening round for the second year in a row, preceded by a meeting between Merrimack (Mass.) and American International (Mass.).

Coach Jan Hutchinson's Bloomsburg unit won its 11th Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference title in the last 12 seasons last week advancing through the losers' bracket to accomplish the feat. The Huskies dropped a 6-5 decision to another national tournament participant, California (Pa.), in the opening game before winning four straight games including wins over Shippensburg (9-0) and Lock Haven (7-1) and a pair of wins over California, 4-1 and 2-0. The Huskies enter the regional tourney with a record of 35-4.

The Huskies used an opportunistic offense, solid pitching and outstanding defense to win the conference crown. Junior pitcher Kim Maguire picked up three of the wins on the mound, while senior Sue Palo accounted for the other victory. Senior Jean Buskirk was the leading hitter as she went 10 for 17 in the tournament.

Buskirk has been on a torrid pace in recent games and has lifted her average to .500 with 59 hits in 118 at-bats. She leads

the team in 12 offensive categories and has scored 30 runs and knocked in 30 others. Her hits include 12 doubles, two triples and three home runs. She is the lone player to perform in all 39 games.

Several other players have accumulated solid averages throughout the season as 15 have played in at least 23 games with nine of those hitting at least .300 helping the Huskies build a .321 average. Senior right fielder Lisa Markle is hitting .368 with 28 hits in 76 at-bats followed by freshman shortstop Jen Lefever at .366 as she has collected 37 hits in 101 at-bats. Senior centerfielder Denise Miller has a .314 average, sophomore third baseman Kris DeSantis is at .310 and left fielder Emily Brown is hitting .306. The contributions from the bench have been a major factor for the club's success as three players, freshmen Jody Barksdale and Kim Lake and sophomore Shelley Miller, are hitting .383, .364 and .313, respectively.

On the mound, Maguire has started 19 games and appeared in 23 getting credit for two saves, while Palo has made 15 starts and pitched in 17 games. Maguire is 16-3 with an earned run average of 0.80. She has struck out 113 and walked 15. Palo is 14-1 with an era of 1.34 and has 33 strikeouts and 12 walks. Defensively, the Huskies are among the national leaders with a .968 average committing just 38 errors in 1,179 chances.

The Huskies are very familiar with their opening-round opponent, Sacred Heart, as the teams have met in 13 previous games, which includes 10 games in NCAA tournament action. The Pioneers defeated the Huskies 2-1 in last year's regional opener, while the Huskies later eliminated Sacred Heart, 5-1. Coach Elizabeth Luckie's Pioneers are 22-7 and won the New England Collegiate Conference.

Senior centerfielder Michelle Palmer, who won the national batting crown in

1991, is hitting a lofty .416 to lead the club. She has 37 hits in 89 at-bats from her leadoff position. Sophomore shortstop Julie Barrett is next at .407 with 33 hits in 81 at-bats followed by senior pitcher April Ertl at .396 and senior third baseman Maria Cavaliere at .379. Cavaliere is the club's power hitter with eight doubles, a triple and three home runs accounting for 24 runs batted in. Palmer is the runs scored leader with 29.

Ertl has built a 17-2 record on the mound with an era of 0.81. She has struck out 49 and walked 29 allowing 105 hits, only eight of those for extra bases. Junior Keri O'Donnell is the other performer on the pitching staff and has a record of 5-5 and an era of 2.90.

Merrimack is the most offensively threatening team in the regional as the Warriors possess five players with batting averages better than .400. Coach Michele Myslinski's team won the Northeast-10 Conference regular-season and tournament championships and entered the weekend with a sparkling 39-4 record.

Freshman second baseman Daniela Paparo is the top hitter in the arsenal with a .475 average including 57 hits in 120 atbats with 17 doubles, two triples and three home runs. Her sister, Raffaella, the club's designated hitter, is next at .433 with a team-high 58 hits in 134 at-bats. Right behind the leaders is junior third baseman Meeghan Coffey at .431, freshman rightfielder Laura Carlson at .401 and sophomore catcher Judy O'Connell at .397.

O'Connell leads the team in extra-base hits with 11 doubles, four triples and nine home runs

Junior Kim Page is the Warriors' leader on a staff that includes five pitchers. Page has made 21 starts, posting a record of 19-1 and has also been credited with two saves. She has 131 strikeouts and has walked only eight. Her earned run average is 0.36.


American International is making its fifth appearance in the NCAA playoffs under veteran head coach Judy Groff and has a record of 30-13. The Yellow Jackets will be meeting Merrimack for the sixth time this season. Merrimack has won four of those games including two of three in the Northeast-10 Conference tourney last weekend.

Junior pitcher Monica Earley is the top hitter for the squad with an average of .385 including 52 hits in 135 at-bats. She has a team-high 11 doubles and six triples. Freshman third baseman Amy Crispino is next at .362 with 38 hits in 105 at-bats. Shortstop Carrie Task is second on the team with four home runs and is hitting .351 and senior outfielder Vanessa Beckwith is at .340. Senior catcher Jackie DeSanty is the home run leader with five.

Earley has made 26 starts for the Yellow Jackets on the mound and has a record of 17-8 in 172 innings. Her era is 0.94, and she has 112 strikeouts and 30 walks. Junior Sherri St. Jacques has started 13 games and has a 12-4 record with an earned run average of 1.78.

Regional notes: The nations' top two winningest coaches in NCAA Division II are leading their teams into this weekend's event as Bloomsburg's Jan Hutchinson is 499-105, while American International's Judy Groff is 486-261-2. Ten of the 16 teams appeared in last year's national tournament, but defending national champion Missouri Southern St. and Bloomsburg are the only two "final four" teams to return. Other regionals that are being played this weekend include: West (at Arcata, Calif.) Cal. St.-Bakersfield (32-4) vs. California-Davis (31-10) and Humboldt (Calif.) St. (44-8) vs. Portland (Ore.) St. (23-9); Central (at Joplin, Mo.) Wayne (Mich.) St. (40-12) vs. Pittsburg (Kan.) St. (36-6) and Missouri Southern St. (37-10) vs. Florida Southern (37-9); North (at Sioux Falls, S. D.) Augustana (S. D.) (53-11) vs. Valdosta (Ga.) St. (41-6) and California (Pa.) (33-7) vs. Nebraska-Omaha (47-8).
