

C. DONALD COOK

A well-known and highly respected intercollegiate sports administrator, C. Donald Cook returns for his sixth year as Sacred Heart University's director of athletics.

He oversees a Divison II athletic program that supports 30 varsity programs and 10 sub-varsity sports which will in 1999-2000 upgrade to the Division I level as members of the Northeast Conference. He has been influential in Sacred Heart's recent athletic facility construction with the addition of newly-completed William H. Pitt Health and Recreation Center and the \$1.6 million synthetic surfaced, multi-purpose athletic field. With these impressive structures, Sacred Heart houses some of the finest athletic facilities in all of New England.

Cook's resume includes 21 years as an athletic director with a Division I program- six at the University of Hartford and fifteen at Fairfield University. He is also a former president of the Eastern College Athletic Conference (ECAC), where he oversaw the administrative activities of the 264 member schools and chaired the executive and finance committees.

Throughout his years, Don Cook has achieved impressive results at his previous institutions. He was instrumental in the development of the physical plants and the growth of the athletic programs at both Hartford and Fairfield, and was co-founder and first president of the

Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference (MAAC). Cook began his career in the coaching ranks at Fairfield University. He served as head baseball coach for 18 years, where he transformed the Stags into a Division I New England powerhouse. During his tenure, the Stags appeared in four post-season tournaments as 15 players advanced to the professional ranks. As Hartford's interim coach at Hartford, Don was able to coach and develop All-Star first baseman Jeff Bagwell.

As a collegiate athlete, Cook was an impressive hitter and top rated catcher. He played three seasons at Fairfield University and served as the Stags co-captian during his senior season, In 1963, he was bestowed the Senior Class Athletic Award from the University.

The Brooklyn-born native has three degrees from Fairfield: a B.S. in economics, an M.A. in couseling (1967) and an M.A. in corporate communications (1977). In 1984, Cook was inducted into the Fairfield Alumni Association's Athletic Hall of Fame, the highest athletic honor at Fairfield, for his accomplishments as an athlete, coach, and administrator.

Cook is married to former Broadway actress Patty Hemenway. Cook has two children, Christopher and Courtney.

Pioneers football begins a new era under first year head coach,

In the past year, the Sacred Heart University football team has endured numerous changes including a new conference (Eastern Football Conference) as well as preparing for Division I-AA play starting in 1999-2000. The Pioneers biggest change during the off-season will be on the sidelines this fall as new head football coach Tom Radulski takes over the head coaching reigns from the program's first and only coach, Gary Reho.

Radulski, however, is not a stranger to the Pioneer program. Last year, he served as offensive coordinator for Sacred Heart and helped Division II Non-Scholarship All-American Brian Ihlefeld reach his second consecutive 1,000 yard season for the Pioneers. This is Radulski's second stint as head coach at the Division II level, where in 1993-95 he served as head coach of fellow Eastern Football Conference (EFC) member UMass Lowell. Prior to his coaching stint at Lowell, the 42-year old Radulski served as a long-time assistant coach under several of the Northeast's most respected head coaches: Columbia's Ray Tellier, Peter Vaas at Allegheny, Steve Stetson at Hamilton, and Bill Bowes at the University of New Hampshire.


Radulski, a graduate of the University of New Hampshire and is married (Paula) and has three children, Regan, 5, Brennan, 2, and Kellen, 6 months.

Pioneers' Preview

Sacred Heart saw their losing streak hit four games last week with a 35-0 home defeat at the hands of Bentley College.

Sophomore running back Toby Lauder was one of the few bright for the Pioneers. Lauder hit the 100 yard mark on 24 rushes, including a 21-yard burst late in the fourth quarter.

Senior receiver Dave Galligani grabbed two balls to bring his reception total to 27. His 4.5 receptions per game average is second best in the Eastern Football Conference.

Junior Terrence Washington accumilated 104 yards on kickoff returns. That raised his return average to 19.7 yards per kick, ninth best in the EFC.

Junior defensive lineman Greg Nota had a standout day with a team-high 10 tackles and one sack. Senior lineman James Thomson also registered a sack, bringing his team-leading total to four. Senior Adam Fuller compiled another nine tackles against Bentley. Fuller's 9.3 tackles per game average is the ninth best in the EFC.

The SHU defense recovered four first-half fumbles from Bentley, but were not able to turn them into any points.

The Head Coaches: This is Tom Radulski's first year as head coach for Sacred Heart. Radulski served as offensive coordinator under SHU's first head coach, Gary Reho. Kevin Callahan has been the Hawks' only coach during the program's first four years of existence. His overall record was 23-13 entering this year.

Monmouth's Preview

Monmouth dropped a rare home game last Saturday, 41-20 to Robert Morris.


Sophomore running back Mike Medrano scored a pair of short touchdowns (one and two yards), and senior QB Dan Sabella hit junior TE Joe Cioffi from three-yards out to account for the Hawks' scoring.

Next Week's Games: SHU finishes a three-game homestand by hosting Pace University next Saturday. Monmouth will return home to host Wagner College next Saturday.



WILLIAM H. PITT HEALTH & RECREATION CENTER

To keep pace with Sacred Heart University's growth in the 1990's, several new athletic facilities have been constructed, highlighted by the recently completed \$17.5 million William H.
