This Is Sacred Heart University

The University: Sacred Heart University is a private, coeducational liberal arts institution founded in 1963 by the Most Rev. Walter W. Curtis, Bishop of the Diocese of Bridgeport. Embodying a new direction within American Catholicism, the University is independent and led and staffed by the laity.

Location: The University is located in Fairfield, a suburban community of 55,000 in Southwestern Connecticut, approximately 1 1/2 hours northeast of New York City, three hours southwest of Boston and one hour southwest of Hartford. More than half of the picturesque 53-acre campus is bordered by a 36-hole golf course. Nearby are the world headquarters for General Electric, *Golf Digest/Tennis Magazine* and The Discovery Museum.

Enrollment: 1,600 full-time undergraduates, 2,000 part-time undergraduates and 1,500 graduate students.

Student/Faculty: 14:1. Seventy-three percent of the faculty holds doctorates.

Degrees Conferred: The University offers baccalaureate candidates a choice of 24 majors in the areas of liberal arts, business and professional studies. Candidates seeking an associate degree can choose from among 26 major concentrations. Master degree programs are offered in the fields of business administration (MBA), (MBA/Health Care), religious studies (MARS), teaching (MAT) and nursing (MSN). Professional Certificates (6th year) in Administration and Advanced Teaching are also offered.

Student Activities: Academic clubs, service clubs, student government, newspaper, yearbook, radio station, social clubs, fraternities and sororities are just some of the activities available to students.

Athletics: The University's intercollegiate athletic program now embraces 15 sports, with more scheduled to be added in the near future. For men: basketball, football, baseball, soccer, lacrosse, volleyball, golf, bowling and cross country. For women: basketball, softball, soccer, volleyball, cross country, lacrosse. An extensive intramural program is available for men and women.

Financial Aid: Moderate fees coupled with numerous aid packages make a Sacred Heart University education affordable to virtually everyone. Approximately 92 percent of enrolled students receive financial assistance from federal, state, University and private sources. For information: (203) 371-7880.

Accreditation: Accredited by the New England Association of Schools and Colleges.

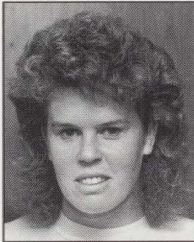

ELIZABETH "BIPPY" LUCKIE

Elizabeth "Bippy" Luckie has a unique vantage point. She been associated with Sacred Heart University's remarkably successful softball program for nine of its 13 years as player, assistant coach and, since 1989, head coach.

In four seasons as head coach, Luckie has directed the Lady Pioneers to three straight New England Collegiate Conference titles and a like number of NCAA Tournament appearances. Her aggregate record is 118 wins, 39 losses and one tie, which translates to a .750 winning percentage. She served as assistant coach in 1986 and '87.

"I learned a lot as a player from my predecessor, Pete DiOrio," she says. "While I didn't always agree with his handling of players, I liked his strategy. He knew so much about the game. What I learned from him has worked for me as a coach."

Indeed, Bippy was chosen by her peers as NECC Coach of the Year in each of the past three seasons.

A two-time All-America shortstop, Luckie led the Lady Pioneers to three straight Final Fours in the NCAA Division II Tournament (1983, '84, '85), capped by a third-place finish in the middle year. Luckie was a slashing hitter with extra-base power, compiling a career average of .357 and establishing several school records including hits in a season (71, 1985).

She was a first-team Converse All-America as a senior and a second-team choice as a junior.

Luckie is considered as one of the University's finest all-round athletes. Her softball exploits are well-documented. On the basketball court, the 30-year-old native of

Ogdensburg, N.Y., was the team's leading scorer for both seasons of eligibility, averaging 19.9 points in 1982-83 and 14.6 in 1983-84. She earned All-NECC recognition both years.

Bippy still holds the single-game scoring record with 42 points against Rhode Island College (2/21/83), and she converted 19 of 20 free throws in a game against New Hampshire College (2/12/84).

Luckie transferred to Sacred Heart from Jefferson Community College in Watertown, N.Y., where she received All-America honors in softball and basketball. A dean's list student, she earned a B.S. in criminal justice in 1985.

Bippy also serves the University as assistant athletic director and head coach of the women's volleyball team. She lives in Bridgeport.

Lady Pioneers seek 4th straight NECC title, NCAA bid

A fourth straight New England Collegiate Conference title and NCAA Tournament appearance? It won't be easy, but Coach **Elizabeth "Bippy" Luckie** (5th year, 118-39-1, .750) believes the 1993 Sacred Heart University softball team possesses enough of the right ingredients to turn dreams into reality. Last year's squad produced a glossy 28-12 record.

Start with gritty pitcher **April Ertl** (Sr., Newtown), whose 15-11 won-lost record of a year ago included a no-hitter (over UMass Lowell) and a 2-1 decision over Bloomsburg in the NCAA East Regional. Her earned run average was a sparkling 1.23. The Lady Pioneers' No. 2 pitcher, **Keri O'Donnell** (Jr., Ronkonkoma, NY), assembled a 13-1 mark along with a 1.86 ERA.

1993 Preview

There is quality, if not quantity, among the squad's position players. All-America centerfielder **Michelle Palmer** (Sr., Norwalk) returns for her fourth and final season with a .505 career batting average and a host of school records. Her 1992 performance included a team-leading .455 average, 66 hits, 45 runs scored and 25 stolen bases (in 26 attempts). Afield, she committed just one error.

All-Northeast third baseman **Maria Cavaliere** (Sr., Stamford) is recovering from reconstructive knee surgery and expects to be ready for full-time duty shortly after the annual southern trip. Cavaliere swung the most lethal bat in 1992, leading the team with four home runs and 36 runs batted in while hitting .336.

First baseman **Elaine Agosti** (Gr., Bridgeport) and catcher **Lisa DiFulvio** (So., New Canaan) are other consistent hitters.

Agosti, a four-year basketball standout, made an auspicious softball debut last spring, hitting .322 and driving in 21 runs. DiFulvio batted a sound .313 in her first season highlighted by a three-hit performance in the 11-inning, 4-3 playoff victory over Bridgeport which decided the NECC title and a two-run homer in the NCAA Tournament win over Bloomsburg. O'Donnell, who starts in right field when she isn't pitching, hit .288.

Replacing the double-play combination of second-team All-America second baseman **Renee Melchiona** (.319) and shortstop **Becky Van Ort** (.339) is the principal problem facing Luckie. **Megan Keefe** (Fr., Winsted), who was one of the leading freshman basketball players in the conference, appears capable of stepping in at second. **Julie Barrett** (So., Manchester, NH), a transfer from Merrimack, is the probable shortstop. Barrett starred at short on Merrimack's 1991 Northeast-10 championship squad.

Another member of the University's basketball team, point guard **Sarah Solinsky** (So., Marion, IN), is a possible infield starter, either at second or at third during Cavaliere's absence. Returnee **Amy Romanas** (So., Worcester, MA) and Ertl (.250) may share playing time in the outfield. One of the newcomers will replace the departed **Nicole DuBack** (.353) as designated player.
