

Resident of Newtown assisted living facility dies from coronavirus complications

NEWTOWN — A resident of a local assisted living facility died April 13 at Danbury Hospital from complications of COVID-19, her obituary said.

Rose Mary Infantino, who worked for the New York City Board of Education as a teacher and guidance counselor until she retired in 2001, also was a parishioner and lector at Corpus Christi Catholic Church.

She was living at Maplewood of Newtown before she died, her obituary said. She was 88.

"Rose Mary taught her children and grandchildren her incredible work ethic, how to look after one another, and how to find a bargain," her obituary said.
