

Establishing a Baseline: US Higher-Ed

Opening the textbook: Educational Resources in U.S. Higher Education by Babson Survey Research

more than 3,000 full-time and part-time professors

2015-2016:

- » only 6.6 percent of faculty members are "very aware" of openly licensed educational resources (textbooks and othe rmaterials)
- » about 5 percent of those professors had assigned a free or openly licensed textbook.
- » 87% said cost is important, but only 5% assigned free or open text

2016-2017:

the number of faculty members at two- and four-year institutions using OER as textbooks has nearly doubled in the last year -- from 5 percent in 2015-16 to 9 percent in 2016-17.

Awareness of OER is still low.




When Selecting Required Course Materials, How Important are the following factors in your selection?






Math Case Study

Open textbook Adoption Process



Impact on Student Learning

- 49% of respondents agreed or strongly agreed that the OpenStax textbooks helped them learn course content*
- 2. 58% of respondents agreed or strongly agreed that xyzHomework helped them learn course content
- Preference for the digital versions of the OpenStax texts
 - free
 - convenience
 - accessibility
 - usability



Impact on Teaching



- Teaching with the open textbook was comparable to or better than teaching with the previous commercial textbook.
- 2. Use of open textbook enhanced teaching, indicating a need to create supplementary materials and utilize board work more than with the previous textbook
- 3. Student use of the textbook was comparable or better than usage of the previous text.

Cost of Commercial Textbook from Spring 2016 (Used)

- MA 106: College Algebra **\$159.25**
- MA 140 Precalculus \$154.00

Cost of OpenStax Print Copies (Digital Access is Free)

- MA 106: College Algebra **\$52.00**
- MA 140 Precalculus \$58.00

Projected cost for commercial textbook: \$86,136.75

Estimated costs for OpenStax textbook \$4,730.00

Estimated total savings \$81,406.75

Estimated saving per student \$147.48


