How to get to

Sacred Heart University

Fairfield Campus

5151 Park Avenue

From Merritt Parkway (Route 15) north or south. (Passenger Vehicles Only)

Exit 47. At end of ramp turn left onto Park Avenue and proceed one block to Sacred Heart University. Entrance on Park Avenue.

From Connecticut Turnpike (I-95) north or south. (Passenger Vehicles Only)

Exit 27A. Continue straight ahead on combined Routes 8 and 25 to fork. Bear left onto Route 25. Take Exit 7, Merritt Parkway south and follow directions above.

From Connecticut Turnpike (I-95) east.

(Commercial Vehicles and Buses)

Exit 27. Continue straight ahead off exit ramp (North Frontage Road). Turn right onto Park Avenue. Five miles to Sacred Heart University.

From Connecticut Turnpike (I-95) west.

(Commercial Vehicles and Buses)

Exit 27. Second left (Lafayette Boulevard). First left under turnpike bridge to North Frontage Road. Follow directions above.

Stamford Campus

Trinity Catholic High School Building
926 Newfield Avenue

From Merritt Parkway (Route 15) north or south. (Passenger Vehicles Only)

Exit 35. South on High Ridge Road. At Vine Road (Turn of the River Hardware) take a left and go half a mile to Newfield Avenue. The University is on the lower level of the Trinity High School building.

From Connecticut Turnpike (I-95) south.

(Commercial Vehicles and Buses)

Exit 8. At the end of the ramp turn right onto Elm Street. Continue for approximately an eighth of a mile. Turn right onto Grove Street and travel north for approximately three miles. The school is on the left.

From Connecticut Turnpike (I-95) north.

(Commercial Vehicles and Buses)

Exit 8. At the end of the ramp turn left onto Elm Street. Follow directions above.

Danbury Campus

at GE Capital

I-84.

Exit 2A Old Ridgebury Road. GE Capital will be the third building on the left after the first traffic light. Classroom on the first floor.

Valley Campus

Derby High School

8 Nutmeg Avenue

Route 8 north.

Exit 18. Left onto Division Street. Under Route 8 bear left at convalescent home onto Chatfield Street. Left onto Nutmeg Avenue.

Route 8 south.

Exit 20. Straight on Derby Avenue. Bear left at shopping center. Right at second light onto Division Street. Follow directions above.

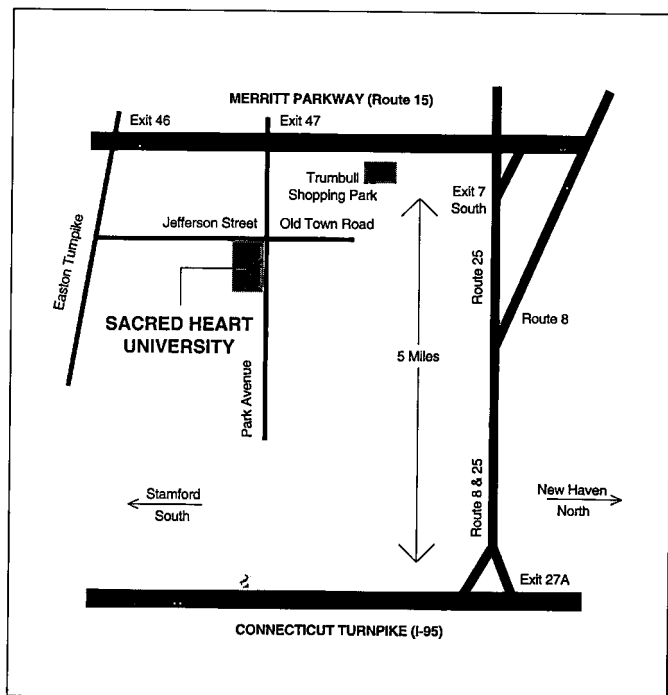

Measles Immunization Law

Connecticut Law requires students born after December 31, 1956 to provide proof of two doses of measles vaccine administered at least one month apart. The first dose of vaccine must have been given after the student's first birthday and after January 1, 1969; the second dose must have been given after January 1, 1980. The student is also required to provide proof of one dose of rubella vaccine administered after the student's first birthday. Laboratory evidence (blood test) is acceptable in lieu of administration of vaccine.

All students must be in compliance with this state law before registering.

Academic Advising

Monday-Friday November 6 - 10, 1995

Full-time students **MUST** have their assigned advisors sign their registration form. Part-time students are encouraged to consult their advisors at least once each academic year. A list of assigned academic advisors is posted outside of the Hawley Lounge. Students declaring a major for the first time must complete a Declaration of Major Application Form available from the Registrar's Office. All current sophomores who have not done so should apply for a major advisor. Those sophomores who are undecided about a major must report to the Academic Advising Services Office, N115, during the Advisement Period for assistance.

Students changing their majors must complete a new major application.

Early Express Registration

1. Advance Notice Postcard

In early November, all full-time and Fairfield campus regular part-time students will receive an Early Express Registration Card. This card will indicate your registration date and the offices from which you are to obtain signatures by Friday, November 10. Failure to do so by this date may cause you to miss your scheduled registration date and time.

You will not be allowed to register unless you present this card at registration with the necessary signatures.

2. Simplified Payment Plan

On the bottom half of the registration form is a Simplified Payment Plan Form. Both sides of the registration form must be completed and signed prior to registration.

3. One-Line Registration

Complete BOTH sides of the registration form. Full-time students must obtain their advisor's signature. Returning part-time students do not need a signature, although advisement is recommended at least once a year.

Please Note: New students pursuing a degree or certificate, non-degree students, visiting students from other colleges, and prior Sacred Heart University students who have not been in attendance for two years or more should visit the Department of Graduate Studies and Continuing Education in order to secure the proper application/registration forms and the signature of an advisor.

Mail-In/FAX Registration

(Returning Part-Time Students Only)

Available Until Friday, December 15, 1995

1. Part-time students may use the registration form found in this booklet. Mail registration or FAX registration is encouraged for your convenience. An advisor's signature is not required for returning students. However, students are urged to take responsibility to become familiar with course prerequisites and degree requirements.

New students, non-degree students, visiting students from other colleges, and prior Sacred Heart University students who have not been in attendance for two years or more, **CANNOT** register by mail/FAX. These students must file an application with the Department of Graduate Studies and Continuing Education, discuss any questions they may have regarding academic issues, and have their form signed by an advisor.

Students registering after November 14, 1995 MUST send at least the first one fifth of the tuition and fees in order for the registration to be processed. Registrations without the proper payment will be returned.

3. Verification of your completed registration will be sent to you.

Should you change your mind after registering, you MUST officially withdraw in person prior to the beginning of class or you will be liable for the FULL TUITION charges agreed upon when you registered. Any changes or additions must be made IN PERSON on an Add/Drop Form which can be obtained in the Registrar's Office.

Payment Plan Options

1. Full Payment

Students can pay tuition and other fees by cash, credit card (MasterCard, VISA or American Express), check, or money order. All checks should be made payable to Sacred Heart University. Students wishing to make one payment for their tuition/fees will be billed December 15, 1995 with payment due by Tuesday, January 2, 1996.

2. Deferred Payment Plan

The University offers a five-month deferred payment plan for students taking 3 or more credits. The charge for the plan is \$37 per semester. The payments are due the first day of each month beginning December 1. To utilize the payment plan, a student (or parent/guardian if the student is under 18 years old) must sign the promissory note on the bottom half of the registration form. The payment schedule is as follows:

December 1

January 1

February 1

March 1

April 1

Statements are sent on the 15th of each month prior to the payment dates. Anyone selecting the deferred payment plan at any point after December 1, 1995 must pay at the time of registration all monthly installments that have been missed under the payment schedule. Any payments received after the first day of the month will be subject to interest of 1% per month on the unpaid balance. Payments will be applied to the oldest balances first, including finance charges.

IMPORTANT NOTE: *If information regarding billing is needed, it is the student's responsibility to contact Student Accounts at 203-371-7925, prior to the scheduled payment dates to avoid any late payment charges.*

A copy of the Promissory Note printed in this booklet should be retained for your records. The copy to be signed and submitted to Student Accounts appears on the Registration Form at the back of this booklet.

3. Academic Management Services

AMS offers a 5-10 month payment plan.

4. Direct Billing through Employer Reimbursement

The University offers an employer reimbursement program to employers who have agreed to our Direct Billing Program. Interested employers should contact Ms. Susan Kanuch in the Student Accounts Office at 203-371-7925 for complete conditions.

5. Students on Employer's Tuition Reimbursement

For part-time undergraduate students who participate in an employer's tuition reimbursement program, Sacred Heart University's Special Financing Program enables students to register for the next term or semester without making any tuition payment at registration if they meet the following program requirements:

A. The student must have a paid-in-full balance for the term or semester they are presently attending, or have just completed.

B. The student has supplied the Student Accounts Office with their personal credit card information as indicated on the registration form. This will authorize the University to charge their personal credit card account the FULL AMOUNT OF THE TUITION AND FEES if the student's outstanding balance is not paid (by the funds from the employer's tuition reimbursement program from the previous term) by March 1, 1996. There is no charge for this plan.

Registrations will only be approved and officially cleared by the Student Accounts Office based on meeting both of the above requirements.

Registration Agreement (Student's Copy)

I accept this program with full responsibility for the courses selected and will pay the tuition and fees associated with these courses. I know that if I need to change or drop any of the courses I must notify the Registrar's Office in writing. I am aware that there are no refunds of tuition and fees for temporary absences from class. I am also aware that there is no refund if I am suspended or dismissed from the University. If withdrawal becomes necessary, I must report in person to the Registrar's Office and complete an official withdrawal form. The registration fee (\$52) is not refundable.

Promissory Note (Student's Copy)

For value received, the undersigned jointly and severally promises to pay to the order of Sacred Heart University all tuition and fees determined by the conditions of my registration, including the housing and meal plan, if applicable.

The sum represents a balance due after payment of a non-refundable service charge of \$37.00. There is no interest or finance charge applicable to the principal amount provided the amount is paid by the due dates. In the event of late payment, an additional amount will be charged of 1% per month on the unpaid balance (annual rate of 12%), such interest to be computed from the due date. Should any outstanding balance be referred to a collection agency for collection, the signer of this note acknowledges that this may affect signer's credit rating.

Should suit be brought to recover this note, or should same be placed in the hands of an attorney for collection, the makers of this note promise to pay as the holder's attorney fees, an amount equal to 15% of the principal amount owing hereon but in no event less than \$50 in addition to the amount found owing hereon. Failure to make payments by due date will result in suspension from classes.

If Estimated Financial Aid is changed or rejected, all balances become the signer's responsibility.

I hereby agree to remit the balance of my tuition/fees obligation set by the promissory note agreement.

Withdrawals/Refunds

Withdrawals from courses MUST be made in person through the Office of the Registrar.

Full-time students withdrawing from the University MUST see the Dean of Freshmen or Director of Advisement for an exit interview.

Part-time students withdrawing from the University or from classes must obtain a course withdrawal form from the Registrar's Office.

Official withdrawal is necessary to assure the proper entry of grades on the transcript and the determination of any refund, if applicable. Refunds are based on the full tuition charges. Failure to withdraw properly will result in the issuance of a withdrawal/failure (WF) grade and payment in full for the course.

If you withdraw before the first day of class, all fees will be refunded, except the registration fee. Once class begins there are no refunds of fees. If your course is canceled, all fees are refunded.

Refunds are based on the schedule below and determined by the DATE OF NOTIFICATION to the Registrar's Office/Advisement Office, not the date of the last class attended.

Tuition Refund Schedule

- 100% - Before start of semester
- 80% - Before start of 2nd week
- 60% - Before start of 3rd week
- 40% - Before start of 4th week
- 20% - Before start of 5th week
- 0% - After 5th week

Please Note: The Refund Schedule is based on the total semester tuition charges and will be used to determine all tuition adjustments.

Financial Aid

If you expect to receive financial aid, a loan, or scholarship, you **MUST** contact the Financial Aid Office before registering. Financial Aid is limited and will only be available to those students who follow the proper Financial Aid procedure and deadlines.

Family Discount

There is a reduction in tuition costs for each member of the same family taking 12 credits or more. Forms can be obtained from the Student Accounts Office (203-371-7925) prior to registration.

VA Eligibility Programs

Veterans and dependents of veterans are eligible for educational benefits in accordance with Title 38 USC Chapter 30-35 and Title 10 USC Chapter 106. Interested veterans should contact the Registrar's Office, Monday-Friday, 8:30 a.m.-4 p.m., at 203-371-7890 for more information.

I.D. Cards

All students are required to carry their student I.D. cards at all times while on campus. Your I.D. card serves as your Ryan-Matura Library card, Dining Dollars and Meal Plan card, as well as an MCI Calling Card (optional). In order to obtain an I.D. card, you need to bring your current class registration/schedule to the Student Union Office. The office is located in the Main Academic Building in the Hawley Lounge, Upper Level. Hours for I.D. service are posted on the door, or call 371-7846 for times.

There is a \$10 fee for all lost or damaged cards.

Health Insurance

It is mandatory that all full-time undergraduate and graduate students show proof of health insurance coverage. If students do not have coverage, they must enroll in the University's insurance program. All international students must enroll in the University's insurance program. For more information, contact the Health Service Office at 203-371-7838.

Parking and Public Safety

Convenient, well-lighted and patrolled parking lots are located adjacent to campus buildings. All vehicles must be registered with the Office of Public Safety. Vehicles without parking permits will be ticketed and towed from campus, if necessary. Vehicle registration may be completed during the regular registration sessions at the Office of Public Safety, located in the

Academic Center across from the gymnasium. Public Safety is open 24 hours a day to assist you. Evening escorts to your vehicle are available. Call 203-371-7995 or stop by the office near the gymnasium.

English and Math Placement Exams

ALL students registering for EN007, EN011 or EF011, EF012, EF051, EF052 and/or MT005, MT006, MT050, MT070, MT080, MT100, or MT151 **MUST** take a placement exam or have completed the appropriate prerequisite courses. Students will be placed in the appropriate course by the results of the placement exam. Placement exams must be taken prior to registration. Once placement has been determined, students are obliged to accept their placement and course sequence. Additional testing is required for EFL (English as a Foreign Language) placement.

Students should register for the English Placement exam by calling the Office of the Academic Incentive Program at 203-371-7812, and for the Math Placement exam by calling the Math Office at 203-371-7770 or 203-371-7772.

Service Learning Program

The Service Learning Program offers students an opportunity to learn and develop through active participation in service experiences that are integrated into the academic curriculum, meet community needs, and provide time to reflect on the experience. Service Learning allows people to develop academic and leadership skills in real life situations, while fostering a sense of caring for others and social responsibility. Service Learning projects, for example, have included teaching children and adults, building houses with Habitat for Humanity, gathering oral histories, working in shelters, after school programs, and social services agencies. Service Learning may involve the entire class, a part of a class, a special project, or be an internship for an individual.

Ryan-Matura Library

The Ryan-Matura Library is the place to go to for information, whether for the answer to a factual question or extended research for a term paper. Librarians are available at the reference desk at all times to answer questions and to assist students in doing their research.

The Ryan-Matura Library currently contains 161,000 print volumes, 1,300 periodical titles and more than 75,000 pieces of non-print material such as video-

tapes, audio-cassettes, phono-discs, microforms, filmstrips and slide sets; 12 CD-ROM periodical indexes of which 6 have full-text journals; 6 multimedia references works; and 4 on-line search systems.

The CARL On-line Public Catalog provides access to the books in this library and to all other CARL libraries in the country. The CARL catalog can be accessed from outside the library via Internet by typing Telnet (pac.carl.org) and following instructions. Materials not owned by the University can be obtained through interlibrary loan or from commercial databases via fax.

Students can obtain a bar-coded library access code from the front desk of the library. A current University I.D. Card is required.

General Studies Major

Flexible Baccalaureate Degree Program for Adult Students

The General Studies program was developed by the University specifically for adult students who are interested in custom designing their own multi-disciplinary curriculum. It allows students to investigate areas of study that best serve their life and /or work situation.

In designing a major, students are asked to select 36 credits from either one or two broad areas of study. The broad areas of study are: 1.) Arts and Humanities; 2.) Natural Science, Numerical and Symbolic Reasoning; 3.) Social Science; and 4.) Professional Studies.

A Capstone Project course is required at the end of the program to synthesize the learning. Each student in the General Studies program is asked to develop a cohesive and comprehensive Plan of Study. The plan ensures that the student is pursuing a meaningful program, rather than a collection of unrelated electives. A faculty advisor assists the student in the preparation of the Plan of Study.

Students in the General Studies program may select courses from the University's regular day and evening offerings. An opportunity exists, as well, for students to take courses in an accelerated format, as well as on the weekend. Credit is also available through the CLEP exams and the Assessment of Prior Learning process. Classes are offered at the Fairfield, Stamford and Derby campuses. For additional information about the General Studies program, contact the Continuing Education Office at 203-371-7831.

Application for Graduation

All students must apply for graduation with the Registrar's Office at least two semesters before completing the degree. Failure to comply may result in a delay of receiving the degree by a semester. All students will be billed for the graduation fee. Students may not take CLEP exams or submit Life/Work Experience Portfolios in their graduating semester. Transcripts and/or Diplomas are not released if any balance is due the University.

Academic Policies

Pass/Fail Option

Beginning with the Spring 1995 semester, the University initiated a new policy allowing students to choose a course with a pass/fail option. The policy has the following conditions:

1. Students are permitted to choose up to 4 courses toward the Baccalaureate Degree and up to 2 courses toward the Associate Degree. Once the course is completed with a grade of pass (P), it cannot be repeated for a letter grade.
2. The pass/fail option must be chosen during registration and cannot be changed after the end of the add/drop period for that semester.
3. Major or minor or education courses cannot be taken under the pass/fail option, except by permission of the major or minor or education department chairperson.
4. Courses can be taken under pass/fail only from Area B or from elective courses. If the course is from Area B, no more than one course can be from any one section of Area B.
5. Courses taken under the pass/fail option will not count in the student's GPA.

Academic Forgiveness

When a failed course is repeated, only the most recent of the two grades will be counted in the computation of the Quality Point Average. The original grade, however, will be kept on the transcript. This policy is limited to the first two F's repeated during undergraduate study. A student who has repeated a course and wishes to make an adjustment to his or her transcript must submit the Repeated Course Form available from the Registrar's Office to the Registrar's Office.

FOR CURRENTLY ENROLLED UNDERGRADUATES

All undergraduate students enrolled prior to June 1, 1995 will have the choice of whether or not to list their GRADES transferred from another university on the Sacred Heart University transcript. This choice affects either all of the transferred grades or none of them. This decision is IRREVOCABLE. This choice concerns only the inclusion/exclusion of the transferred letter grade; the names of the transferred courses and the number of accepted credits WILL remain on the Sacred Heart record regardless. Students entering after June 1, 1995 will have only the credits transferred; the grades will not be listed on the Sacred Heart University transcript.

The choice of whether or not to include transferred grades will affect your Sacred Heart GPA, class rank and graduation honors.

Note: Transfer students under the new system must complete at least 60 credits for a Bachelor's degree or 30 credits for the Associate's degree at Sacred Heart University to be eligible to graduate with an honors designation.

This policy does not apply to May 1995 graduates.

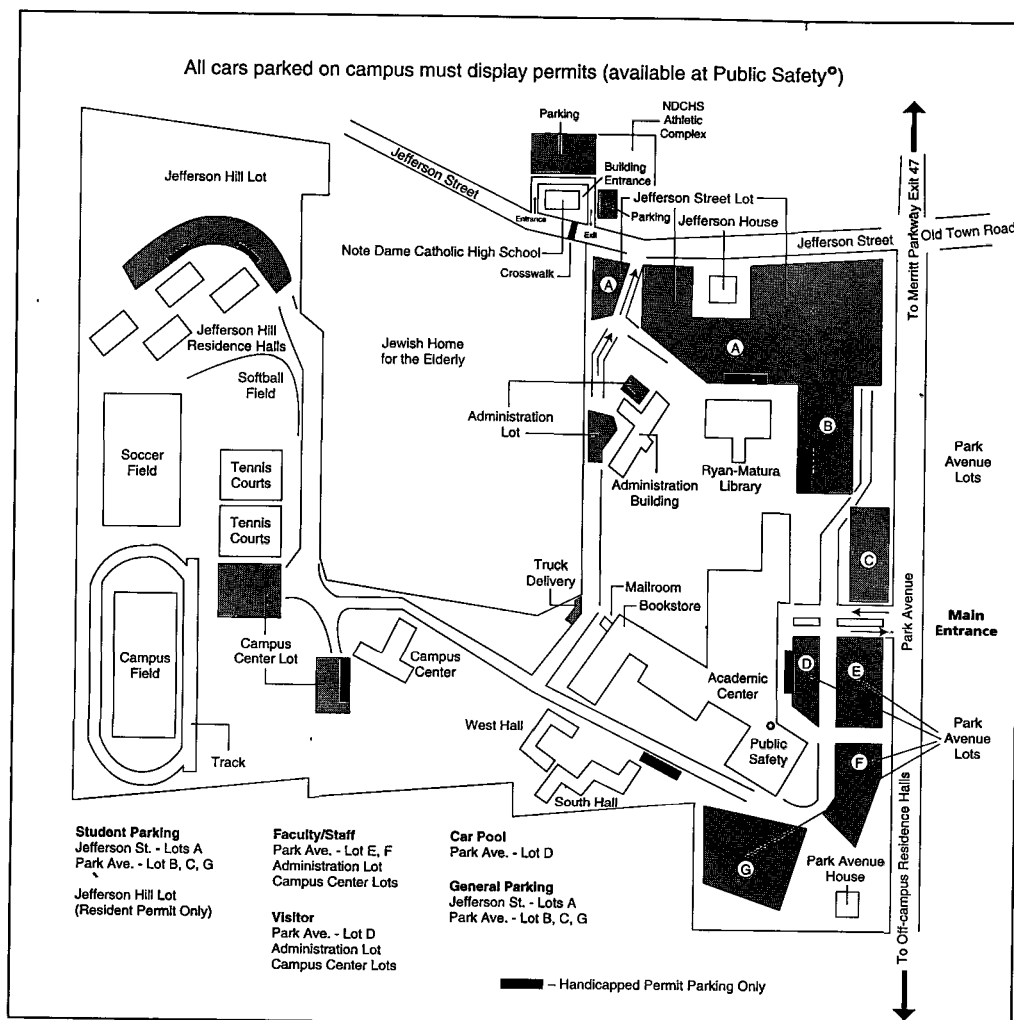
