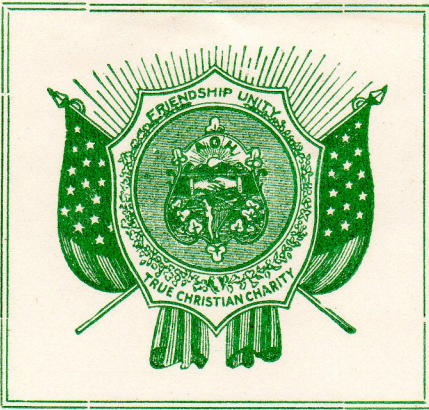
There is only one County back on the last National assessment if that was in I would be all right again I will get it in as soon as I can.
