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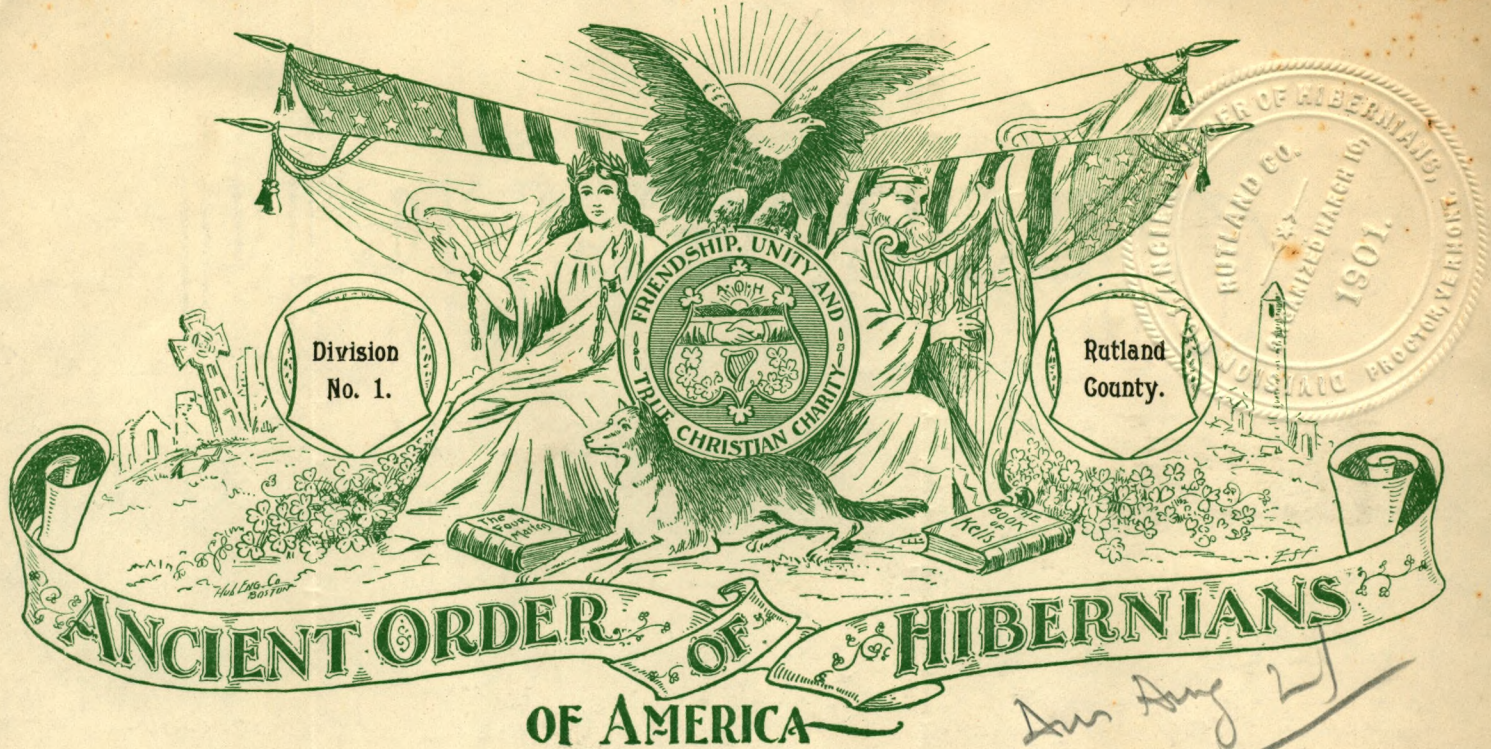

was no report from Vermont  
last year. The trouble was  
all at the City of Rutland  
with there Division. and  
it was the same this year  
I have been there three times  
and succeeded yesterday  
in fixing matters all right.  
and also got there per "Cop."  
Tax. \$31.20 that is on 104 members  
that were in good standing  
when this was issued. this  
makes a total I have paid  
you of \$79.50 or tax on 265 members.  
you see you levied on 360  
on the report of 1901. where  
in 1902 we were near 100  
members short of that. the  
Division of Bennington dis-  
banded in 1902. and Rutland

Division lost sixty  
five members. so that is  
just how we stood. But  
we have been doing some  
thing this year. and I have  
sent you the report all  
most up to date and  
you will see we have a  
fair increase and I am  
of the opinion that it  
will be twice as much by  
1905. Now in regard to

merchandise from your  
office, I must say this  
that I am unable to

forward it to you at this writing but hope to the next. We had a State meeting in Rutland yesterday at State Presidents office and we issued a State tax. There has never been a dollar in State Treas. It is very plain to see how I have been hands down, but every thing in the R.O.H. line is under good head way now, and it is going to be that way in the future. Hoping this and the report prove satisfactory.
